

One of the key principles that **HART** is founded on is "integrity" in all its dealings with people, donors, churches, organizations, its ministry partners and governments.



From a scriptural perspective, integrity must be an essential part of the operations of a Christian organization.

Child Sponsor Project

Bringing hope to impoverished children and their families

- Nutritious food
- Clothing
- School supplies
- Medical-dental care
- Summer camp experiences
- Birthday and Christmas presents

Currently, we have about 800 children in our Child Sponsor project in Ukraine.

We're also looking into the feasibility of expanding this project into the country of Moldova. Economically, it's in worse shape than Ukraine, so the Child Sponsor project will be a tremendous help to our partner churches there. How so?

Firstly, because this project provides the finances (thru sponsor support) to help poor families living in their communities.

Secondly, their children's ministries will inevitably expand due to the number of children impacted by them through this project.

And thirdly, the church will typically attain 'favored' status with local government officials, because of their work with poor families resulting in less government interference for their church.

Medical-Dental Aid

Bringing hope and healing to the poor

Sustainability

Providing a hand-up

Micro-finance loans. In 2009 we provided capital to expand many small businesses in Ukraine.

Farm animals. We were able to provide farm animals for poor families and rehabilitation farms for former drug addicts/alcoholics.

Farm equipment. We provided much needed agricultural equipment such as tractors, combines and trucks for rehabilitation farms.

Skills training. We supported ministries that provide vocational training for women, orphans, ex-prisoners, at-risk youth.

Job creation. We accomplished this through projects such as HART'S Play-Center project, in which we construct and install playground apparatus for orphanages, foster homes & camps. HART also brings 'construction' Missions teams from the West, and our policy is to always hire local labor and purchase materials in the communities we are working in.

Training, equipping, providing support for...

Human Trafficking

Preying on girls from poor families

Ukraine is one of the top "source" countries for young girls abducted or lured into the worldwide sex trade industry.

To address the issue of Human Trafficking, HART and its partners have developed a proactive preventative strategy which includes:

- Engaging & educating Churches throughout Ukraine on this issue.
- Providing educational resources/tools for them
- Enabling and supporting local Ukrainian churches & ministries moved to action
- Providing support for specific preventative strategies. For example we've underwritten the cost of producing thousands of brochures on Human-trafficking and a documentary on this issue. These resources will be used by our Partner churches to share in High Schools in Ukraine. Thousands of young people will be hearing about issues such as this one, as well as on drugs, alcohol, sex etc.— all from a moral/biblical perspective.



Muslim outreach

Providing education, training and finances

We are expanding our outreach into the Muslim communities of Ukraine. HART is currently supporting Indigenous missionaries to the Muslim Tatar people of Crimea, Ukraine.

We are also providing micro-finance loans to Tatar Christians as they impact their communities economically and spiritually.

HART continues to assist young men from several of the "stan" countries

(Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan etc) receive the theological education/training they need to impact their countries through the "underground" church movements.

We are currently working with one of the larger Evangelical bodies in Canada to develop a much broader strategy for impacting Muslim countries in Eastern Europe with Indigenous missionaries.



Gypsy Ministries

A people group despised and ostracized

Gypsies are at the bottom of every socio-economic indicator in Ukraine: the poorest, the most unemployed, the least educated, the shortest life span, the most imprisoned and most segregated. HART is partnered with several ministries whose goal - by word and deed - is to demonstrate God's love to those living in Gypsy ghettos.

- Relief Aid for these poor gypsy families
- Water wells for gypsy ghettos; providing water for drinking and hygiene
- Providing financial support for Gypsy pastors
- Financial help for construction of churches in Gypsy villages

What your giving is accomplishing



1. Senior Care projects. Caring for the elderly living on meagre pensions. Supporting Senior care facilities.

2. Construction projects for indigenous Churches. Providing financial assistance and resources to National churches; also for church construction projects.

3. Micro-finance projects. Providing short term loans which create opportunities and employment.

4. Foster Homes. Providing financial and material support for Christian orphanages and Foster homes.

5. Summer Camp programs. Providing summer camps for hundreds of orphans, children with disabilities, street kids, and children from impoverished families.





1. Special needs ministries. Support for ministries assisting the physically challenged, hearing impaired, the blind, and those with cerebral palsy.

2. Boys prisons. Providing skills training to young boys in prison, and employment upon release.

3. Orphan Care Project. Providing a mother's love for abandoned babies.

4. Disaster relief. Providing relief aid for victims of flooding in the Carpathian mountain region.

5. Gypsy Ministries. Providing water wells for gypsy villages, church construction projects, and summer camp programs for gypsy children.



Our hope and vision



For almost 20 years now, Ukraine has been undergoing a political, economic and social transformation. Far from being swift and simple, the initiation to democracy and capitalism has been difficult, drawn out and by most standards an abysmal failure.

Despite its wealth of natural resources, Ukraine limped into the 21st century with a 'poor cousin' status in comparison to neighboring countries in Central and Western Europe.

Although life under the autocratic Soviet system was hard, it was nonetheless a model of stability. This has been replaced by a capitalism model that is anything but stable; controlled by oligarchs, and a ruling government elite, who instead of reforming Ukraine, have spent the past two decades focused on attaining personal wealth and power. Stability is a distant memory.

However, the biggest problem facing Eastern Europe today is not economics or politics, but the moral and spiritual degeneration of its citizens. If there is any lesson to be learned from history, it is that this is the greatest enemy of stable economic, political and social systems.

Their collective moral compass, broken under the yoke of communism, has resulted in systemic corruption in virtually every sector of society... the government, the police force, the judiciary, academics and healthcare, etc.

The general feeling of despair, disappointment and hopelessness is palpable, and has produced catastrophically high rates of alcoholism that is devastating the family unit in Eastern Europe.

So, what is the solution for Eastern block countries like Ukraine? The only solution is a wholesale change in the hearts and minds of it people.

And the solution must begin where the problem begins - with the individual and their need for redemption. This restored relationship with God through His son Jesus and renewed heart is the motivating force and distinctive behind HART'S strategy for Eastern Europe.

Our objective is nothing less than to transform this country (one heart at a time) by practically and effectively demonstrating God's love to the poor, the orphan, the widow, to street kids and to those in prison. To provide hope for the hopeless, love for the loveless, justice for the oppressed and freedom for those imprisoned.

Given that the majority of our projects and partner ministries are focused on children and youth, it is our dream to one day see a new crop of political, social and economic leaders of Ukraine, who had Christian values instilled in them as children through projects and ministries and summer camps that YOU supported.

This is our hope and vision. And we are privileged to be working side by side competent and dedicated National Christian leaders who share and work tirelessly toward this same vision for their country.
