During this year, the life of the Church in Carpathian Mountains has taken several directions. One of them is the land improvement works: we laid out the pavement and arranged the yard. The second is carrying out God's ministry. We organize Sunday worship services, evening meetings once a week and prayer hours. The Sunday school is also developing. In general, our task is not only to organize the planned meetings, but also to make every effort during the week to communicate with non-believers so that they may be more open and start to attend the House of Prayer.



Recently, we hosted a week-long camp. The camp was themed and called "Always put God first". The number of children varied daily, but in general, many children passed through the camp. The agenda included Bible lessons and seminars about how our world was created. The



children were impressed and did not want the camp to end. We ate together, studied, played games, prayed and praised God by songs. Many children bring their friends and relatives, and then they bring many Christian values to their families. And they may not immediately start living exactly as the Word of God says, but their attitude toward believers is changing for better.

We try to organize home groups regularly. We currently have a lot of Christian materials and books that have been organized to give the most open answer to the questions of the people of the region. In this region, virtually all people consider themselves believers, with a large percentage of them practically not reading the Bible. Their faith is full of traditions. So, in fact, there is a lot of work and it takes a lot of time and efforts to provide a convincing answer to the supposedly simple questions.



This year, we put strong emphasis on the preaching of Gospel. And it is not just about Divine Services or home groups that are the foundation of the life of the Church, but the Gospel as the calling of every Christian. We teach believers that in order to be an active Church we must constantly go beyond the Church and reach out to people. Go and preach, teaching them what we have accepted. This year we have one brother who was ordained as an evangelist. So the ministers in the field of God are becoming more... The Gospel preaching and the training of young ministers is very important to us.



We also have the opportunity to visit families whose children are in Child Sponsorship project. This makes it possible to read and preach the Holy Bible with them. We are consistently in touch with Gypsy families in our village. Also, from time to time, a prayer service is held at a local hospital with seriously ill patients.
