I want to share with you a story of one man Volodymyr. He is 36 and he has been fleeing from the shooting and bombing in his home village and ended up on the street. His wife died when the artillery shell hit their house. She couldn't get into the basement before the bomb blew the house up, and got stuck under the rubble. Volodymyr and his wife were an ordinary family of unbelievers who didn't have children.



After the tragedy, Volodymyr got into the hospital with heavy wounding. When he completed the treatment, he realized that he had no house to come back to, and what is even worse, no one alive to share his grief with... He took a train and headed to Mariupol city.

In the city he didn't see why he should start a new life... No hope and no motivation made Volodymyr bitter, disappointed and ... always drunk. He lived in a basement like a vagrant, even though he used to work as a nurse and could find a job if he only wanted to... However, the personal loss and his destroyed house were

unsurpassable obstacles. The memories and hatred poisoned his present life.



Once he visited one of our free dinners at the church. The ministers were preaching about Jesus and prayed over the man. When he came back the next time, he himself asked for a prayer. The brothers suggested him that he reconcile with God and forgive those who killed his wife. It wasn't easy... Volodymyr couldn't forget the terrible scenes of that day... But something inside was telling him it was the only way to gain peace. Today he remembers that life changing dinner at church with gratitude: "Back in the days, I thought the most terrifying fear is to sit in the basement of your house, as if paralyzed, and just wait, hoping that the missile would not hit your shelter... But then I realized that there is nothing worse than the life without Christ, no greater fear than the fear of hell."



Starting from that day in the church, Volodymyr has decided to accept Jesus and change his life. He found an inner power to forgive those who killed his wife and finally got a job. After three months, he even got promoted. Today, Volodymyr is a blessed brother who takes an active part in church ministry and earnestly studies the Bible. God has changed and rebuilt his destroyed life, so that now he can help such people as himself to recover from losses and the nightmares of the war.
