The Critical Importance of Summer Camps

Today, the people of Ukraine and its allies have a myriad of priorities to focus on, and the most important one is to do everything possible to ensure that Ukraine stays strong and wins this war.

But there is another imperative that, if not fulfilled today, Ukraine will have no future. And this task is taking care of the health—body, mind, and spirit—of its children and young people.



We extend our deepest gratitude and respect to HART partner churches in Ukraine, who, despite such dark times for the country, remain committed to nurturing the next generation.

For many years now, Ukrainian churches and their dedicated leaders have been organizing a wide array of summer camp programs. The primary aim of this vital ministry is to provide children with the opportunity to encounter God as their loving Heavenly Father, forge meaningful friendships with their peers, and put the Christian principles they have learned into practice in their everyday lives.

There were doubts about whether summer camps could even take place during wartime. However, the Ukrainian church refused to let the conflict stop this vital ministry. In fact, the war may have even opened up new opportunities, as there are now greater challenges and more groups of children in desperate need of care and support.

Many of these campers have experienced the horrors of war firsthand. They have been forced to flee their homes, seeking refuge in safer areas. Some have even lost parents or loved ones who are serving on the frontlines, protecting their country. These children have endured unimaginable trauma at such young ages.

But the reality is that no child in Ukraine is truly safe. Air raid sirens disrupt their sleep almost every night, and school lessons are constantly interrupted as they are ushered into bomb shelters. A recent international study revealed that a staggering 75% of Ukrainian children are now showing symptoms of mental trauma.

Thanks to the generous financial support of HART's donors, our Ukrainian ministry partners were able to organize a wide variety of summer camps for children and youth across the country last year. This included programs in relatively safe regions as well as in areas that had been recently liberated from occupation.

It is impossible to provide an exact total of the number of children impacted by the collective camp efforts of all HART's ministry partners across Ukraine. However, it is clear that these initiatives reached thousands of young people from a wide range of ages and backgrounds.

For many of these children, the camps offered a rare chance to simply be kids again - to play, learn, and grow in a safe space. Amidst the chaos and trauma of war, these programs provided stability, comfort and joy. Most importantly, the campers were able to encounter the love of God and the support of a caring community.
